JOIN IAF AS AN – AGNIVEERVAYU

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA - Agniveervayu

Nationality : Should be an **Indian** Citizen.

Age Criteria

- a. The minimum age limit for enrolment in IAF as an Agniveervayu is 17½ years as on date of enrolment and maximum age limit is 21 years as on date of enrolment. However, exact Date of Birth block as published in advertisement is to be followed.
 - b. In case, a candidate clears all the stages of the Selection Procedure, then the **upper age limit as on date of enrolment should be 21 years.**

Marital Status and Pregnancy

Only **unmarried** candidates (male & female) will be eligible for enrolment as Agniveervayu in IAF. And they shall undertake not to marry during the defined engagement period of four years. Keeping in view limited period of engagement of Agniveervayu inclusive of training, skill development activities, practical as well as formative assessment and organisational requirement of continued service of Agniveervayu during the engagement period, longer absence of Agniveervayu during the engagement period will adversely affect the operational efficiency of the Indian Air Force. Agniveervayu who marry during the said period shall be discharged from the service. Further, only unmarried Agniveervayu will be eligible for selection in regular cadre as Airman. Female candidates additionally shall be required to undertake not to get pregnant during the engagement period. Such women Agniveervayu on becoming Low Medical Category (LMC) due to pregnancy shall be liable to be discharged from service. Pregnancy will debar the women Agniveervayu for selection into Regular Cadre. At the time of enrolment, candidates shall require to sign a voluntary undertaking accepting above conditions.

Education Criteria

Eligibility for Civilian Candidates

(a) Science Subjects:-

- i. Candidates should have passed Class Intermediate/10+2/Equivalent examination with Mathematics, Physics and English from an Education Board recognized by Central/State/UT Govt with minimum 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English.
Or
- ii. Candidates should have passed three years Diploma Course in Engineering (Mechanical/ Electrical / Electronics/ Automobile/ Computer Science/ Instrumentation Technology/ Information Technology) from Polytechnic Institute recognized by Central/State/UT Govt with 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English in Diploma Course (or in Intermediate/Matriculation, if English is not a subject in Diploma Course).
Or
- iii. Candidates should have passed two years Vocational Course with non-vocational subjects viz. Physics and Mathematics from Education Boards recognized by Central/State/UT Govt with 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English in Vocational Course (or in Intermediate/Matriculation, if English is not a subject in Vocational Course).

(b) Other than Science Subjects:-

- i. Candidates should have passed Intermediate/10+2/Equivalent Examination in any stream/subjects from Education Board recognized by Central/State/UT Govt minimum 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English.
Or
- ii. Candidates should have Passed two years Vocational Course from Education Boards recognized by Central/State/UT Govt with minimum 50% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in English in Vocational Course or in Intermediate/Matriculation if English is not a subject in Vocational Course.

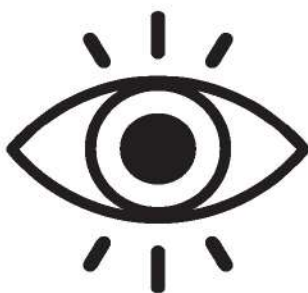

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS / GUARDIANS

1. Parents are requested to check the school diary daily and to acknowledge the circulars.
2. Uniforms are required to be clean and tidy. For this all parents are required to purchase two blue uniforms for their ward.
3. All students must carry their text books/exercise books according to the time table for that day.
4. Regularly check the diary for teacher's remarks for performance in class as well as home work.
5. Encourage your ward to take interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
6. Get a dental and an ophthalmic check up once every year.
7. Students suffering from infectious disease like- Conjunctivitis, Dermatitis, Scabies etc. should not be sent to school.
8. Students suffering from chronic disease like Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatic heart disease, etc. are advised to be under continuous medical supervision of a specialist doctor. History of their illness must be filled in the diary along with the treatment being taken.
9. Parents of class Nur, LKG, UKG are required to send a hanky, small napkin, a spoon with the lunch box of their ward.
10. We do not appreciate the gesture of sending gifts from children to teachers for birthdays/celebrations.
11. Parents/guardians are requested to notify the school any change in their address.
12. Parents should discourage their children from bringing valuable articles to school. The School is not responsible for any article or money lost.
13. Read the contents of this diary carefully and please abide by the rules laid down by the school authorities.
14. The School reserves the right to suspend, expel or take strict disciplinary action against a student whose conduct is harmful to other students and the school.
15. Avoid littering paper in the school premises.
16. No parent is permitted to enter the classrooms. Parents are not allowed to meet teachers during school hours without prior appointment from the Principal.
17. No parents are allowed in the class for celebrating birthday parties.
18. The ward of those parents, who avoid meeting the authorities, when advised to do so, may not be allowed to attend the classes.
19. Parents should not try to contact the Principal or teachers over the phone after school hours unless it is very urgent. Parents can meet the Principal and teachers during the 'Visiting Hours' at school with prior appointment.

20. *Our school is a Polybag-free zone. All parents are requested not to send or bring any article like tiffin, stationery, craft articles etc. to school in polybags.*
21. *Cooperating with school officials in matters pertaining to school discipline is solicited.*
22. *Reporting any suspected child abuse or neglect situation in accordance with the Children's Act and Sexual offences Amendment Act 2000.*

Code of Conduct & Discipline : Students

1. The observance of rules of discipline and good behaviour is essential to a student's continuance in the school. The decision of the Principal/HM is final and binding on all students in respect of rules/instructions framed for discipline and good behaviour.
2. **Forbidden Practices.** No student is to indulge in any of the following:-
 - (a) Disfiguring/damaging any school property.
 - (b) Smoking in/around school premises.
 - (c) Any form of playing cards or gambling.
 - (d) Carrying or using mobiles, iPod, iPad, laptops or any other video, electronic and communication device in the school premises.
 - (e) Use of drugs or intoxicants, except on the prescription of a registered medical practitioner.
 - (f) Chewing of betel leaves, tobacco, gutka, pan masala, chewing gum etc in the school premises.
 - (g) Rowdy or rude behaviour.
 - (h) Use of violence in any form and ragging/eve-teasing or passing lewd comments.
 - (i) Practice of untouchability or advocating of its customs, communalism or any such social evils.
 - (j) Being in possession of or viewing/reading/screening/sharing/forwarding any kind of pornographic/in appropriate material by SMS/email or any other medium. They are instructed not to discuss or criticize the school or their teachers, school staff/authority on Facebook, Twitter or any other social media.
 - (k) Indiscipline involving fighting/theft/any other act which may bring disrepute to the Student/School or to the Air Force in general.
 - (l) Driving a two/four wheeler to school without a valid driving licence and helmet (incase of two-wheelers).

(m) No student will be involved in ragging. Ragging is an act wherein senior students use the fact of being senior to ill-treat their juniors and put them through an unacceptable level of discomfort and disturbance. These acts may include physical and psychological assault or threat (intimidation) or use of force or any mode of restriction, or demeaning the status, dignity and honour of junior students or subjecting them to mockery and acts that affect their self-respect or use of abusive language and aggressive, vulgar and indecent behaviour with the juniors

3. Striking-off name from school rolls. The name of a student may be struck off from the school rolls for any of the following :-
- Non-payment of fees and other dues within 30 days after the last date of payment.
 - Absence from school without leave application from parent/guardian for 15 consecutive days. When a student remains absent from school for four consecutive days without a leave application from the parent/guardian, the Principal / HM is to intimate such absence to the parent/guardian of the student to ensure that the parent/guardian knows about the absence.

FOR ADMISSION IN CLASS XI (As per AFS Guidelines 2025-26)

AFS Students: Admission in different streams viz Science and Commerce of Class XI in AFS will be based on Percentage (%) scored in class X examination as under:

- (i) Science Stream : A Minimum of 60% Marks.
- (ii) Commerce Stream : A Minimum of 50% Marks.

Note:- If seats remain vacant in class XI even after admitting the children of AF Schools then the admissions to Non -Air Force children may be granted on the same criteria in the sequence of categories of priority.

However, there could be instances of lower enrolment in Class XI in AF School, especially those located in hard stations and remote areas after applying the above criteria for admission. In such an eventuality the Principal may send the proposal of lowering the eligibility criteria for various streams along with the details of registration, No. of eligible students, etc. to the Chairman, Air Force School, Jaipur. The Chairman, AF School may use her/his discretion in lowering the eligibility criteria.

SCHOOL FEES

1. Every student is allotted an admission scholar number. The number must be quoted in all correspondence with school.
2. School fee is payable from 01st to 10th in first month of the quarter starting from 01 Apr, 01 Jul, 01 Oct and 01 Jan.
3. Students/Parents who fails to deposit fee by due date (as declared) will be levied with a fine of 100/- for first seven days and 200/- will be charged for next seven days. If the fees is not deposited within 14 days, 500/- will be charged (beyond 14 days) or name of the defaulter will be struck off from the school roll.
4. If the fees is not paid till the last working day of the first month of quarter. The name of the student will be struck off from the school rolls without any further notice.
5. Re-admission fee of Rs. 1000/- will be charged if a child is granted re-admission.
6. The fees is to be deposited through online mode only. To pay the fee online, parents need to login to www.airforceschooljaipur.edu.in using the link PAY FEE ONLINE provided on AF School Website with the student's Admission number as User/login ID (Admission No.) Parents can view the amount to be paid as fees under Pay Fee Online Link, wherein you need to enter your name, age and mobile number and can pay the fees by using your Credit Card, Online Net Banking, NEFT/RTGS or UPI facility.
7. Fee circulars are sent through students as and when payment of fees is scheduled. If fees not paid within given grace period time the name of the student will be struck off from school roll.
8. All fees are non refundable, once it is paid.
9. Fee may be revised at any time during the year if needed.

HOME EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION RULES

1. The final assessment of a pupil at the end of the Academic Sessions shall be based on the achievement of student in the periodic assessments. Regular Home and Class work and Projects/ Practical under taken by him/her through out the year.

Gender:	Any candidate if found to have predominant characteristics of the opposite gender as evident on external physical examination, will be rejected as Unfit. Any candidate having undergone gender reassignment surgery will be declared Unfit.	
Pregnancy (For female candidates):		Any candidate, if found to be pregnant shall be disqualified and her candidature will be rejected.
Body Tattoo:	Permanent body tattoos are not permitted. However, tattoos only on inner face of the fore arms (inside of elbow to the wrist), back (dorsal) part of the hand/ reverse side of the palm and Tribals with tattoo which are as per the custom and traditions of their tribes may be considered. Offensive, obscene, indecent, sexist or racist tattoos are prohibited regardless of location on the body. However, right to consider a tattoo acceptable or unacceptable will rest with the selection centre. Candidate with permanent body tattoos are to submit two Postcard size photographs (close up and distinct view) with details of size and type of the Tattoo during the second phase of testing.
